MISSION & VISION

Education transforms lives.

The KGSA Foundation partners with the Kibera Girls Soccer Academy (KGSA) to provide a free, holistic high school education to 130+ girls every year in Kibera, Kenya – one of Africa's largest informal settlements.

Through financial and technical resources, the Foundation supports KGSA's academic programming in addition to nutrition, health care, extracurricular and leadership initiatives along with higher education scholarships for graduates to unlock potential, expand opportunities, and enable each girl with the ability to shape her future.

Together with KGSA, we are working to break the cycle of poverty for the girls and their families, empowering them to become stronger, more independent and resilient women.



HISTORY

In 2002, Kibera resident Abdul Kassim started a soccer program to get girls off the streets and into something productive. His dream was to create a free high school for girls as a way to promote self-awareness, empowerment, and equality. He felt that through active participation in education, the arts, and athletics, the girls would have the opportunity to develop confidence and strong minds, bodies, and spirits; empowering them to become inspiring leaders in their own communities and country, advocating for a brighter future for Kibera and Kenya.

PHILOSOPHY

We believe local problems need local solutions. We believe in the power of the #girleffect. We believe that all girls have the right to a quality education in which their rights are respected and they feel safe and protected. We value transparency and accountability.

WHERE WE WORK

Kibera is the largest informal settlement in Africa. It is a diverse and vibrant community full of caring and hardworking individuals and families. However, Kibera faces many challenges including high unemployment, poverty, overcrowding, and insecurity. It is underserved by health, education, and sanitation services.

WHY GIRLS?

44% of girls in Kenya don't finish high school. Research shows that girls who earn a high school degree are more likely to earn more, marry later in life, practice family planning and raise healthier children.

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

2022 Highlights

TWO CLASSES GRADUATED

The Class of 2021 completed the KCSE exams in April followed by the Class of 2022 in November. All of the girls passed and graduated from KGSA! The Class of 2021's test scores were lower than past years as was the case for seniors across Kenya. However, scores bounced back up for the Class of 2022 with two girls qualifying for a bachelor's program and three for a diploma degree. We are proud of their extraordinary effort during these shortened academic years.

SOCCER IS BACK

After a two year hiatus due to the pandemic, the school soccer team resumed training and games. In September, KGSA inaugurated its rooftop soccer field with a friendly exhibition match between the senior league and the school team. The local media showed up to report on Kenya's one and only rooftop AstroTurf! Big thanks to Under Armour for donating new uniforms and equipment and to Construction for Change for procuring an anonymous donor to fund the project.



SCIENCE LAB RENOVATED

Rotarians from Nairobi Upperhill and Upper Eden in the United Kingdom renovated the science lab providing much needed equipment and storage to enhance chemistry, biology and physics lessons. Historically, science and math test scores have been the lowest at KGSA. The teachers are grateful for this STEM investment to encourage the girls and introduce career paths that have been dominated by men in Kenya.

US TOUR

School Director Teka and Teacher Dalifa visited three states in three weeks

In September and October, Teka, Dalifa and Katy visited California, Colorado and Minnesota to connect with supporters. We enjoyed conversations over meals and our first in-person events since before the pandemic. Thanks to everyone who hosted us!

We toured Pacific Ridge School in Carlsbad (below) and McAuliffe International School and Girls Athletic Leadership School in Denver to learn how teachers are integrating technology into the classroom and creating interactive lessons. We cheered on the San Diego Wave FC at the new Snapdragon Stadium. Dalifa was delighted to test medical technology at Philips' labs in the Twin Cities.









While Teka and Dalifa were in town, the Foundation Board of Directors held a retreat in Denver to discuss strategic planning. Based on feedback from teachers, alumnae and board members, we decided that our top three funding priorities are to invest in STEM, board all girls and provide scholarships for every KGSA graduate to pursue higher education. Many supporters have already stepped up to help us advance these goals. Special thanks to the family foundations and STEM professionals for their geneosity and commitment to KGSA.

The story of KGSA's evolution of a girls' soccer team to an accomplished high school is both inspirational and remarkable. It is through the hard work and dedication of KGSA's founders, faculty, staff and supporters that the school provides a safe haven for young women from Kibera for whom a high school education would have otherwise been unattainable. We believe that with continued support, the impact of KGSA will continue to grow and be felt by even more young Kibera women and their families.
